

Disaster Management Training for Health Care Providers (DMT)

This program is a 2 day workshop aimed at healthcare preparedness during disasters. The first day of this workshop emphasizes on orientation to principles of disaster management and hospital emergency incident command system and a detailed discussion on how incident command system is an effective way in responding to the disasters. Workshop also gives greater emphasis on triage, onsite

patient assessment & management at the disaster site and in the casualty rooms of the hospital. More time is spent on learning about specific injuries including Drowning, Electrical injuries, Hazardous material, Falls from height, Hypothermia, Burns, Animal bites and stings, Psycho emotional stress, Motor vehicle related accidents and dehydration etc. Participants also get oriented to hospital preparedness where they learn about preparing and implementing hospital preparedness plan in their hospitals. Workshop will also provide an opportunity to the participants to discuss case studies and present a draft hospital preparedness plan on the final day of the workshop.

The course content is as follows:

- 6. Hospital preparedness for disaster
- 7. Emergency Health Management issues in disasters with special mention of Communicable and Non- Communicable diseases during cyclones/flood
- 8. Case study discussion
